HISTORY Founded in 1957 as the Service League of Lafayette by 17 civic-minded women. These driven women changed the landscape of our community. In 1974, the Service League of Lafayette was admitted into the Association of Junior Leagues, and officially became Junior League of Lafayette. Collectively, AJLI represents 293 Junior Leagues having over 155,000 members across 4 countries. Today with over 600 members, Junior League of Lafayette remains one of the strongest and progressive mid-size Leagues across the Association.

GIRLS ON THE RUN INDIVIDUALS SERVED: 350

*“One girl at a time Girls on the Run has changed 1 million lives.
One girl at a time we will change 1 million more...”*

Powerful words about the newest Junior League of Lafayette program, Girls on the Run. In 2014 Junior League launched a new community program partnering with Girls on the Run South Louisiana and Boys & Girls Club of Acadiana. During a 10-week semester, girls in grades 3rd–8th are taught the tools to embrace their individual strengths and successfully navigate life’s experiences. Fun games incorporate running into the program that concludes with the girls running a 5K partnered with an adult running buddy. Girls on the Run believes that “every girl can embrace who she is, can define who she wants to be, can rise to any challenge and can change the world.” ■ With expansion into the Lafayette area, Girls on the Run held its first 5K at Girard Park in December 2014 with 127 girls running and 250 community runners participating. The first race was a huge success that led to expanded participation for the May 2015 5K held at downtown Parc San Souci. ■ Bringing the program to Boys & Girls Club has been a great partnership. In our first year we directly impacted 60 girls, with 15 parents taking part in the 5K. If the first year of Girls on the Run is any indication of the future, Junior League of Lafayette can help many more girls unleash confidence through accomplishment while establishing a lifetime appreciation of health and fitness.

JUMP WITH JILL

INDIVIDUALS SERVED: 2,090

For more than 57 years Junior League of Lafayette has remained committed to improving the general well-being of women and the healthy development of children. In an effort to fight childhood obesity, encourage healthy eating and increased exercise, Junior League brought Jump with Jill to the Heymann Performing Arts Center in November. Jill is a rock star nutritionist who had more than 2,500 Lafayette Parish fifth grade students jumping and dancing to songs about good nutrition and exercise. ■ “This is my body, I only get one, So I gotta take good care of it to keep having fun” is one of the lyrics we heard



from the song, Healthy is Good For Me. Certified nutritionist Jill Jayne and her brother Mark rocked the Heymann Performing Arts Center like the children were attending a rock concert. They danced, sang and clapped to the songs Jill presented. Before



leaving their schools that afternoon, each child received an autographed picture of Jill, and a CD was given to each teacher for their classroom. The League worked in close collaboration with the Lafayette Parish School System, as well as every elementary school in Lafayette Parish, including home-schooled children to put on this event. It was a huge success!

JUNIOR QUIZ BOWL

INDIVIDUALS SERVED: 146

Junior Quiz Bowl is a program that promotes academic excellence and builds self-esteem through academic competition. During competitions, teams of seventh and eighth grade students answer questions about history, geography, math, science, popular culture, and other topics. Junior League Committee members serve as moderators, timekeepers, and scorers with assistance from the Lafayette High School Beta Club and Key Club. After 12 weekly competitions from September through March, Junior League of Lafayette

held its final tournament for the year on March 7 at Lafayette High. This year, 28 teams from 14 area schools competed. Paul Breau won the final championship match against Episcopal School of Acadiana. Junior League of Lafayette has been promoting academic excellence by organizing and implementing this program for more than seventeen years.



YOUNG AT HEART

INDIVIDUALS SERVED: 294

Young at Heart is a program designed to increase empathy for the elderly where Junior League of Lafayette partners two local high schools (Lafayette High and St. Thomas More) with two retirement homes (Rosewood and Emeritus) to enable interaction between the old and the young. The program allows students and residents to develop meaningful relationships where they enjoy one another and converse about past and present times.

League members serve as liaisons and coordinate monthly activities. This year, participants made fall arrangements, painted pumpkins, made cornucopias, Christmas wreaths, and personalized stationary. Residents were also pampered with manicures and entertained with a magic show. The year ended with coffee and bundt cakes, and each resident was presented with a plant to brighten up their room. It was an eventful year with good participation by all.

KIDS IN THE KITCHEN

INDIVIDUALS SERVED: 102

The Kids in the Kitchen Committee visited the Boys & Girls Club of Acadiana on Monday and Thursday evenings to spend time with the children starting in September and ending in April. A portion of the Kids in the Kitchen program involves a very hands-on experience with kids learning how to prepare easy, healthy meals for themselves. The other part of the program includes learning about the importance of



living an active lifestyle. The committee members who teach the children about healthy eating are called the Kitchen Crew. The menu changes every week and introduces fruits and vegetables that in some cases the kids may not have even tried before. It is a fun environment to try new things and talk about making healthy choices when grocery shopping and preparing meals. The Activity Crew rotates different events every week including zumba, pilates, circuit training, and they also bring in guest speakers. The kids were thrilled to meet Representative Vincent Pierre who spoke to the children about “Being the Best You Can Be.” He encouraged the kids to be the best students and role models in school, at home and in the community. Each session concluded with a graduation dinner, and the children were thrilled to eat at Mellow Mushroom where they had the opportunity to order off the menu and practice table etiquette. Upon program completion, the kids were excited to receive a Kids in the Kitchen t-shirt and cookbook.

SMILES

INDIVIDUALS SERVED: 551

Junior League of Lafayette partners with Miles Perret Cancer Services to provide an opportunity for the families at MPCS with cancer to have a fun outing each month. This committee has enjoyed creating many SMILES, and the SMILES Committee had quite a year! The year started off early with an important summer project. In July, the SMILES Committee hosted the Back-to-School project where they gathered school supplies for more than 100 student participants. Since that first activity, SMILES participants and committee members spent Saturdays once a month



hosting various events including: Lafayette Science Museum, Noel Acadien au Village to look at the Christmas lights, a Men’s and Women’s ULL basketball game, Painting with a Twist, Build-a-Bear Workshop and Zoosiana (formerly the Zoo of Acadiana). The SMILES Committee also treated participants to two



CYT Performances put on by CYT, Cinderella and Mary Poppins, which included a pre-performance reception with refreshments and arts & crafts activities and an opportunity to meet some of the cast members and take pictures after the performance. Once again, this year, the SMILES Committee helped families in need to have good experiences together while going through difficult times.

NO FEAR NO FUTURE

INDIVIDUALS IMPACTED: 300+

Each year, in the Troop I area, over 60 families who planned to celebrate Christmas, Thanksgiving, and Birthdays, instead planned funerals for their family members because of motor vehicle accidents, most caused by drinking and/or distracted driving. Junior League of Lafayette is doing what it can to help lower these numbers by educating young men and women on the impact of those dangerous decisions. For the 12th year in a row, Junior League of

Lafayette has hosted a NO FEAR NO FUTURE (NFnF) campaign against distracted and impaired driving. In addition to this year’s two-day event, a public service announcement on several media outlets offered safe driving tips to thousands of listeners over several months. The mock crash used real student “victims” and allowed students to witness the repercussions of drinking and/or texting and driving. The mock crash and student assembly is a cooperative effort between Junior League of Lafayette and community partners and first responders that include Acadian Ambulance and AirMed, the Lafayette Parish Sheriff’s Office and Coroner’s Office, Lafayette Police Department and Fire Department, Louisiana State Police – Troop I, Fountain Memorial Funeral Home, Guy’s Towing, Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital, and the Eric Searcy Foundation. The students at Northside High were unsure of what



to expect when Junior League of Lafayette brought this program to their school. But after an impactful two

day event, the participants were thankful, impressed, and moved to tears with the strong emotions they felt witnessing the effects that impaired or distracted driving could cause on their lives. Kathy Roy, a teacher



with Northside High states, “The NO FEAR NO FUTURE program could not have come at a better time for our Juniors and Seniors. With Prom held the following weekend, the mock crash scene and messages from the guest speakers, truly left a lasting impression on our students.”

THE CARE BUS

INDIVIDUALS SERVED: 62

The Care Bus is a mobile healthcare initiative that increases healthcare access to children attending Acadian Middle School. The project that first began at Truman Montessori in 2007 as part of Junior League of Lafayette’s 50th Anniversary Project, is a

collaboration between Our Lady of Lourdes Regional Medical Center, the Lafayette Parish School System, and Junior League of Lafayette. Every other Wednesday of the school year, Junior League members, accompanied by nurse practitioners from Our Lady of Lourdes Regional Medical Center and the school staff, work together to provide healthcare services for the children. The clinic provides services including preventative care, sick visits, immunizations, flu shots and sports physicals. These services not only assist in providing a healthy learning environment at Acadian Middle, but they also reduce school absences attributed to illness and lack of current immunizations. The Care Bus began in September by attending Acadian Middle’s Open House. This was a great opportunity to address hundreds of parents and provide them with information on how their child can take advantage of the many services The Care Bus offers. One of the goals of The Care Bus is to help Acadian Middle School students be up-to-date on immunizations. Thanks to Junior League members, the health prospects of the children at Acadian Middle are improved!

COMMUNITY RESEARCH

INDIVIDUALS IMPACTED: 227

Junior League of Lafayette Community Research Committee helps to develop the future of the League by researching and developing programs to meet

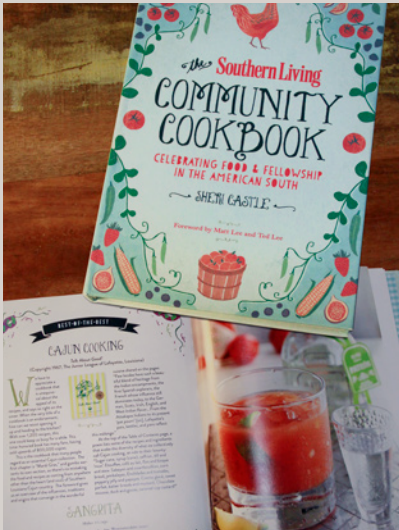


community needs that fall within the Junior League of Lafayette focus area. The Committee also provides ongoing examination and evaluation of the focus area, including assessment of continuing existing community programs. This year Junior League of Lafayette Community Research Committee hosted a “Done in a Meeting” service project where League members brought their families to the October general membership meeting and together decorated picture frames to be distributed as welcome gifts to



children joining the CASA of SoLA program. In April, the committee hosted a Community Breakfast to bring together other local non-profit organizations in order to facilitate open dialogue and collaboration among agencies with similar or complementary interests. The breakfast was well attended and also provided the Junior League of Lafayette Collaborative Opportunity Grants Committee with a platform to seek grant applicants for the 2015–16 year.

COOKBOOKS Since 1967, Junior League of Lafayette has shared recipes through our award-winning cookbooks. Having proudly sold over a million copies, profits from our cookbook sales fund projects that make a difference in the lives of women and children in our community.

TALK ABOUT GOOD! *Talk About Good!* has sold over 780,000 copies since 1967 and is currently in its 31st printing. It is considered by most to be the “bible” of down home Cajun cooking.

TALK ABOUT GOOD II *Talk About Good II* is currently in its 10th printing and offers 915 triple-tested recipes. It has the distinctive benefit of having drawing and prints from the beloved Cajun artist George Rodrigue of Blue Dog fame. In 2013, Louisiana lost a great artist and man. Junior League of Lafayette remembers our internationally-acclaimed local artist George Rodrigue for his lasting contribution of Cajun Culture depicted in his artwork in *Talk About Good II*. He will be greatly missed in our community and throughout the world.

TELL ME MORE This unique Louisiana cookbook is currently in its 5th printing and has the distinction of being illustrated by the world famous artist from Church Point, Louisiana, Floyd Sonnier. In 1994, *Tell Me More* received the Southern Regional Tabasco Community Cookbook Award.

SOMETHING TO TALK ABOUT Our newest addition illustrates how we cook, eat and celebrate in Lafayette. It features 12 occasional menus, with over 230 eclectic recipes, and color photographs to assist with all of your entertaining needs. In 2006, *Something To Talk About* was awarded the Favorite Recipes Press Cookbook Award which honors the Junior League that conducted the most successful cookbook program for the prior year.
