culminates with girls feeling physically and emotionally prepared to complete a celebratory 5K running event.

A national rock & roll nutritional program that takes childhood obesity by storm, serving as a kid-appropriate approach for kicking off wellness initiatives, reinforcing classroom learning, and supporting a healthier cafeteria menu. A special thank you to Lafayette Parish School System, and this year's participating schools - Ridge Elementary,

Milton Elementary, Woodvale Elementary, Prairie Elementary and Cpl. Michael Middlebrook Elementary.

For two decades, Junior Quiz Bowl has been a fun academic competition involving teams from area



junior high school students. The students participate in six weekly competitions in the fall. followed by six weekly competitions in the spring, culminated by a final tournament in March. This year's program would not have been possible without the

### **DONE IN A MEETING**

Helping Neighbors in Need December 2018

Each year, Junior League of Lafayette members participated in a Done in a Meeting project during the December General Membership Meeting. Supplies were purchased to fulfill personal care hygiene kits requested by The Emily House. The Emily House is an emergency shelter serving primarily homeless women and children in Acadiana. The shelter strives to rapidly return families to permanent housing following their temporary stay at The Emily House.

With an increase of house guests during the wintry Christmas season, the need for additional personal care kits were on the rise. And Junior League members were ready to be of service! Members assembled kits including shampoo, soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, lotion, and lip balm. Enclosed in each of these care kits was a handwritten, inspirational message for the women and children who would receive them.

Located in Lafayette, The Emily House represents Catholic Services of Acadiana's most recent endeavor to respond to women experiencing homelessness in Acadiana.

- More than 10,000 shoppers visit the holiday market each year.

Food is a cornerstone of Cajun culture. In southern Louisiana, especially, friends and family come together to share meals, stories, laughter and to make memories over food. Junior League of Lafayette has been creating some of those memories with the help of our four incredible cookbooks. "Tell Me More," the third Junior League of Lafayette cookbook, is now in its fifth reprint and has sold over 77,000 copies. "It is so much more than a cookbook! It is a historical storybook worth reading even if you don't cook one thing!" explained Lisa Breaux, original Cookbook Committee member.

First published in 1993, Junior League of Lafayette's "Tell Me More" celebrated its 25th anniversary this year. While it went from conception to print in just 12 months, a quick turnaround in the industry, the pages feature multiple award-winning recipes that have been perfected over many years. Winner of the 1994 Southern Regional Tabasco Community Cookbook Award, "Tell Me More" is a beautiful book featuring art and stories from Floyd Sonnier. As Cookbook Chair, Erin Alleman shared, "Peruse for the artwork; enjoy the recipes. It's a beautiful book to have on your shelf, and share with your family especially as a native Louisianan."

Junior League celebrated this 25-year milestone throughout the League year with celebrations and activities showcasing some of the incredible recipes. League members crafted some of their favorite recipes to share with members at General Membership Meetings. Samplings were also presented to the community during both the League's Kitchen Tour and Tinsel & Treasures. More favorites were offered during the 25th Anniversary celebration event in which a special silent auction was held awarding the winner with a framed and signed print of Dance with Me, Papa, one of Sonnier's beautiful pieces. When asked why this was one of her go-to cookbooks, Val Senegal summed it up best, "Most of the recipes can be accomplished with simple kitchen pantry items, which is how most creoles and Cajuns cook now-a-days."

Food brings people together. "My kids are grown, but we all love to cook. We work all of our time together around the food ... and it's fun to read the stories while we cook. Floyd Sonnier did an amazing job of describing Cajun life through his art and stories," expressed Jennifer Briggs, Sustainer. Junior League of Lafayette is proud to celebrate 25 years of helping people make delicious food and craft special memories.

Junior League Day at the State Capitol is a day where Junior League leaders are able to meet with legislators and policy makers to discuss issues that are important to Junior Leagues in Louisiana. On April 25, 2019, Junior League of Lafayette participated in the action-packed day.

This is a day dedicated to collaborating and educating both those that represent Junior Leagues as well as others that share a passion to help vulnerable, at-risk women and children in our state. It was an educational, yet fascinating day at Louisiana's State Capitol in Baton Rouge, which included a morning conversation with legislators and government officials, a legislative luncheon featuring Kyle Ardoin, Louisiana's Secretary of State as keynote speaker, a historical tour of the Capitol building, and morning

legislative committee visits. Louisiana Junior League members were recognized on the floors of both the House of Representatives and the Senate before having the opportunity to meet with our local elected officials including Senators Fred Mills and Page Cortez. Senator Mills also recognized Junior League of Lafayette members in the Senate Health and Human Services Committee meeting.

In addition to meeting with policy makers, Junior League of Lafayette members learned about the election process, heard from other nonprofits that share similar interests, and publicly demonstrated the power of the collective voice of Louisiana Junior Leagues. Junior League leaders were empowered by state leaders to be the change to improve our great state in our own communities!

# Ranning for a Path



The undertaking of Junior League of Lafayette's Diaper Bank all began during the aftermath of the 2016 flood. With many families in our area experiencing devastation, our League received an unprecedented number of requests to assist with diaper needs. Upon the realization that a shortage of diapers in Acadiana was a very real problem, our League began to search for a long-term solution. A few months later, the League's leadership team presented diaper bank research to our Board and it was then that Junior League of Lafayette's Diaper Bank initiative was officially horn!


When considering new League programs, it is important research conducted shows a significant gap in the community. In this case, the research pointed to some astounding statistics about the needs of Louisiana families. To start, the average cost of diapers for one child for one month is about \$80. Another surprising piece of the research was that most government assistance programs do not cover the purchase of diapers. But the most persuasive statistic stated that one in three families struggles with diaper needs. Ultimately, low-income families suffer the most from both financial and health effects of diaper needs. At that time, Louisiana had three diaper banks distributing 1,113,461 diapers annually. However, there was


still a major unfilled gap in the needs of Acadiana residents, and Junior League of Lafayette knew we wanted to be a solution to this problem.

To set the program into motion, Fund
Development Chair Chrissy Morris and Sustainer
Linda Alesi, attended the National Diaper Bank
Conference in Atlanta in October 2018. By the
following May, our Diaper Bank Committee and
members of our Board were able to visit both the
Baton Rouge and New Orleans Diaper Banks,
where they were able to gain insight into how
the Diaper Banks operate. These trips were
instrumental in our planning phase as well as
helping us understand how best to set up a Diaper
Bank in our own community.

"We are excited to have laid the foundation for Junior League of Lafayette's Diaper Bank program this year," shared Kimberly McCaffrey, 2018-2019 Diaper Bank Chair. Our warehouse is currently housing over 25,000 diapers which will be divided into packs of 25 for distribution. It is the goal of the Diaper Bank Committee to finalize the League's community partners for this program by the end of 2019. Ultimately, the diaper need in Acadiana can be met through the type of volunteerism that is directly aligned with the Mission of Junior League of Lafayette to support women and children in the community.

# Provisionals

Every year, the Provisional class comes together to create and implement their own project that effects change in our community. But before they embark on a project, culminating all they have learned throughout the year, this group of women is trained and exposed to a rich history of voluntarism spanning over 61 years.

This year, the 40 Provisionals partnered with Second Harvest and Scott Middle School to execute a Nutrition and Tasting Expo for the Provisional Project. After months of research and development, this group of ladies shopped and prepared 240 individual servings of healthy snacks such as hummus, yogurt, edamame, kiwi and fruit infused waters. On March 20, 2019, the ladies came together to see their vision in action and successfully completed their goals of introducing the students to healthy foods, providing a new take on old foods, and exposing students to brand new foods. The results impacted everyone involved – both by the children learning new, healthier snacking options and by empowering the provisional members as they move forward with their active years of volunteering in the League.
