Twenty-four years ago an idea was brought to life. Since 1994, Tinsel & Treasures has been a premier social and economic event for Junior League of Lafayette and the community. Held inside the CAJUNDOME for its first seven years, Tinsel & Treasures eventually moved to the CAJUNDOME Convention Center and through the decades, the market has grown to include 135+ merchants from across the United States. More than 10,000 shoppers now visit the market each year. Since its inception, Tinsel & Treasures has raised over \$5.6 million, which has been used to provide financial support to further the League's Mission to promote voluntarism, develop the potential of women, and improve the community

through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers.

The inaugural Tinsel & Treasures was held in October of 1994. When the contract was to be signed for the following year, Tinsel & Treasures was bumped because the Ice Gators Hockey Team would host their first season in 1995. Tinsel & Treasures was then moved up to the last weekend in September which turned out to be a popular and successful date. That timeframe has now become a tradition to kick-off the season of holiday markets.

In the second year of Tinsel and Treasures, the Afternoon Tea & Style Show was implemented, with Abdalla's as the featured store providing the fashions until they closed their doors.

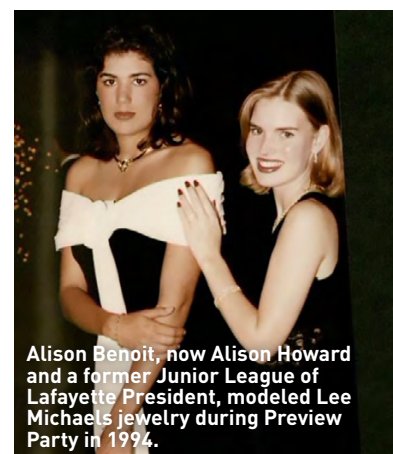

This year, Junior League of Lafayette is happy to celebrate the 25th anniversary of *Tell Me More*. *Tell Me More* is the third cookbook published by Junior League of Lafayette and has sold over 70,000 copies since its publication in 1993. Not only does *Tell Me More* feature over 264 delicious recipes, the cookbook also tells the story of Cajun culture and heritage alongside gorgeous prints by the late world-renowned Cajun artist Floyd Sonnier. *Tell Me More* can be purchased for a special price of \$14 throughout its 25th anniversary year.

You may remember that *Talk About Good*, Junior League of Lafayette's flagship cookbook, celebrated its 50th anniversary last year. First published in 1967, *Talk About Good* began a legacy of community cookbooks that has

successfully raised more than \$1.2 million.

Proceeds from the purchase of any Junior League of Lafayette cookbook supports community programs in Lafayette and the surrounding areas that have a direct impact on women and children.

Lil' Jeanne's Birthday Cake Tell Me More – Pg. 174

Step 1:

- 2 cups sugar
 - 2 cups flour
- Combine in a large mixing bowl

Step 2:

- 1/2 cup cooking oil
 - 1 stick margarine
 - 1 cup water
 - 3 tbsp unsweetened cocoa
- Combine with dry mixture in mixing bowl. Beat at low speed for 1 minute

Step 3:

- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup buttermilk
- 1 tbsp vanilla
- 1 tsp baking soda

Take 2 eggs and beat well. Mix into bowl 1/2 cup buttermilk and 1 tbsp vanilla extract. Add to other ingredients. Sprinkle 1 tsp of baking soda over mixture. Mix one minute. Pour into 11x8x2 inch pan and bake at 400 degrees for about 20 minutes. Ice while hot.

Icing:

- 1 stick margarine
- 6 tbsp Pet milk
- 3 tbsp unsweetened cocoa
- 1 box confectioner's sugar
- 1 tbsp vanilla extract

Bring first 3 ingredients to a boil in a saucepan. Pour into mixing bowl and add confectioner's sugar and extract. Beat until smooth and creamy. Pour over hot cake and let cool.

During the months of June and July, the SMILES committee was hard at work kicking off their first event of the year. Junior League of Lafayette's SMILES committee - in collaboration with Miles Perret Cancer Services (MPCS) - recently purchased and organized school supplies for 134 SMILES families.
