ICON Arts & Cultural Award

Junior League of Lafayette was honored to receive the 2018 ICON Arts and Cultural Trailblazer Award. The ICON Awards event celebrates those in the community who have made an impact on Acadiana through Arts, Business and Culture. Money raised from the event is contributed to the ABC Fund, housed within the Community Foundation of Acadiana, and is used to help sustain and support artists, arts organizations and Acadiana's cultural assets.

It was an honor to be acknowledged for the work we've done over the past 60 years to help support the arts in our community. In 1957, 17 civic-minded women founded the Service League of Lafayette to effect positive change in the community. The organization grew rapidly, eventually becoming Junior League of Lafayette, and through the decades has had a hand in shaping some of the most cherished community institutions such as Acadiana Center for the Arts, the Paul and Lulu Hilliard University

Art Museum and the Lafayette Science Museum.

In 1967, Junior League of Lafayette once again pioneered an invaluable piece of culture with the award-winning, nationally recognized cookbook, *Talk About Good!*. Now a staple in most Louisiana kitchens, this cookbook is filled with some of our region's best recipes, and along with *Talk About Good II* (1978), *Tell Me More* (1993) and *Something to Talk About* (2005), is an important source of history and reflection on Cajun kitchens in South Louisiana.

As it did 60 years ago, Junior League of Lafayette continues to offer financial and personnel resources to support not only arts and culture, but a variety of nonprofits in Lafayette. The League has granted funds to projects, as well as provided the collective talents and volunteer efforts of League members. Members are an integral component to enacting community change, in

part due to innumerable training opportunities, ensuring that League volunteers are well-versed in their areas of focus and equipped with the skills to make Lafayette better.

At the heart of the work, the Mission of Junior League of Lafayette has been constant: members are committed to promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women and improving the community through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers. Now as an organization of more than 650 volunteer members strong, the League remains focused on influencing positive and lasting change in the community.

In receiving the ICON Trailblazer Award, Junior League of Lafayette joins other influential artists and business leaders who continue to make a difference in arts and culture in our community.

Generations of Service Voluntarism as a Family Affair

Junior League of Lafayette has made an indelible mark on the community and thousands of women's lives, especially the lives of those members who are lucky enough to have family join them in their membership. With 60 years of service to Acadiana, there have been countless family members who have shared the love of Junior League of Lafayette together. It is not

uncommon for grandmothers, mothers, daughters, aunts, nieces and cousins to wear the hat of voluntarism together. Even as time marches on and change throughout the decades has been constant, for these women, the love of volunteering and the commitment to improving the lives of women and children in Acadiana remains the same.

For this mother and daughter, the connection to community service truly began at the beginning. Darrellyn Burts' mother, Mrs. Margaret Ramsey Copeland, was the Service League's first President, and her step-mother, Mrs. Lucille Proctor Copeland, was the third. Burts reflects on her own start as a Provisional back in 1975 and how the League has truly molded her into the person she is today. "I was a shy girl, but the League taught me public speaking and organizational skills and gave me the opportunity to serve on numerous other Boards in the community." As with any non-profit organization, Junior League of Lafayette's fundraising efforts are a key component in accomplishing the Mission. From the best-selling cookbook series, *Talk About Good!*, to Christmas

Comes Alive, and now Tinsel & Treasures, these women have seen the support of the Lafayette community truly flourish over the years. "I used to go with my mom to Christmas Comes Alive, then held at Blackham Coliseum, for many years, and now to see how it has grown into the current Tinsel & Treasures event is truly amazing," says Burts' daughter, Maggie Justus. "I love hearing all the stories from my mom and grandmother's active years of service, and now my favorite part is getting to attend Sustainer functions together." Burts adds, "The League has grown so much since my start in a provisional class of 12 women. But the best part of being in such a wonderful organization with family, is sharing the history and love of the League together."

Junior League has been a part of this dynamic family since its inception, and is still going strong today. Lesleen Owen, one of the original charter members of the Service League of Lafayette, a former President and now a Sustainer Emeritus, is most surprised at the sheer size the League has become. "It continues to grow bigger and bigger every year," she says. "The League is not only bigger, but also more diverse than when I joined," adds daughter, and also former President, Leslie Hayes. Hayes credits the League for giving her the training and skills she needed to start her own business. "Really, for me, the amount of technology that has developed over the years, and the way we communicate and organize voluntarism is the most notable

difference," remarks Hayes. Today, the family tradition continues with Owen's granddaughter, Corita Kraemer Kuon, joining the next generation of League members. For Owen, having her daughters and now her granddaughter as members is one of the most special parts of Junior League of Lafayette. "It's truly a blessing to attend all of the League's functions together as a family," she says. As a provisional member, Kuon feels fortunate to carry on the legacy of these remarkable women. "I love seeing the examples my aunts and grandmother have set for me," she states, "and I'm looking forward to serving our community, learning new skills, and developing relationships with other like-minded women.... just as they did."

Gail Billeaud joined Junior League of Lafayette in May of 1982, and the very next year, Lauren was born. Like many children with hard working Junior League mothers, Lauren was introduced to the League at quite a young age, which usually involved running errands around town for her mother's placements. Whether it was as a guide at Acadian Village or working Christmas Comes Alive for many years, Gail always loved her time as an active member in the League. "I truly developed wonderful friendships over the years, which fortunately still continue today," says Billeaud. Now

that Lauren is in her second active year, the mother/daughter duo have been able to share their voluntarism together. This past year they were able to work on Kitchen Tour, and most recently shared shifts at Tinsel & Treasures. In noticing the difference in her daughter's time in the League now compared to hers, Billeaud remarked, "There are so many more night and flexible placements offered to women who work. I have been impressed with the group of professional women that are leading the League in such a great direction."

Cookbook Milestones

The 2017-2018 League year marked two important milestones for the beloved Junior League of Lafayette cookbooks. In 2017, Junior League of Lafayette was excited to announce the 50th anniversary of its flagship cookbook, *Talk About Good!*. Since 1967, Junior League of Lafayette has sold almost 800,000 copies of this wonderfully crafted book filled with recipes from the diverse women who make our community great. In celebration of its golden anniversary, *Talk About Good!* was sold at a discounted rate of \$19.67. In addition, each month in the League's member-only e-publication, a different birthday cake recipe was highlighted, keeping the anniversary celebrations going all year long!

In 2018, the third Junior League of Lafayette cookbook, *Tell Me More*, celebrated 25 years in print! This Southeast Winner of the 1994 Tabasco Community Cookbook Award has been a wonderful addition to South Louisiana kitchens and is bursting with delicious recipes. The book reveals stories of past and present Cajun traditions, along with fond food memories. In this third cookbook installment, readers learn to make great dishes using basic pantry items. All of the recipes are from legendary Cajun cooks, as well as those of a new generation. *Tell Me More* also features illustrations by renowned Cajun artist, the late Floyd Sonnier. Over 60,000 copies have been sold since it debuted in 1993.






Junior League of Lafayette takes great pride in our beloved *Talk About Good!* cookbook series, which has served up delicious recipes in Acadiana's kitchens for 50 years. With its long-standing success, it's clear that Junior League members aren't the only ones taking notice. *Talk About Good!* hit a new level of acclaim with its recent feature in The Washington Post on August 14, 2017. Since the article's publication, *Talk About Good!* sales have skyrocketed! People have called in orders from all over the country, sharing their own stories, memories, and love of the treasured cookbook. At least seven large cities have recognized *Talk About Good!* and covered the 50th Anniversary story in their own publications. *Talk About Good!* is the second highest selling Junior League cookbook of all time. As a League, it's exciting and humbling to see people from across North America still celebrating and embracing this cherished cookbook 50 years after its original debut.



Community Programs

Through strategic partnerships with local nonprofit organizations, over 600 Junior League of Lafayette members contribute thousands of fundraising dollars and volunteer hours to improve the lives of women and children in our community. Many of our members spend much of their time serving on one of our community placements. Our community events and partnerships offer a first hand, interactive view into the impact the League has in the community. These placements allow League members to work hand-in-hand with just a small sample of people served through Junior League's efforts, but the effect it has on our members is immeasurable.

Like Junior League of Lafayette, **Girls on the Run**, an international positive youth development program, believes in the potential of young women. The mission of Girls on the Run is to inspire girls to be joyful, healthy and confident using a fun, experience-based curriculum that creatively integrates running. Designed for girls in middle school, Girls on the Run teaches life skills through dynamic, interactive lessons and running games. The program culminates with girls feeling physically and emotionally prepared to complete a celebratory 5K running event.



Jump with Jill Jump takes childhood obesity by storm, serving as a kid-appropriate approach to kicking off wellness initiatives, reinforcing classroom learning, and supporting a healthier cafeteria menu. The Jump with Jill show, which Junior League of Lafayette brings to various local schools, has been performed live over 1,000 times for 250,000 kids all over the United States and Europe and has been featured in national media outlets including Nickelodeon,



Sprout, PBS, NPR, and The Washington Post. **Junior Quiz Bowl** is an academic recall competition involving teams from area junior high schools. The students participate in six weekly competitions in the fall, followed by six weekly competitions in the spring, culminated by a final tournament in March. The League's volunteers assist as moderators, time keepers and score keepers for each competition.



Over 15 years ago, Junior League of Lafayette recognized an opportunity to educate youth on the risks and consequences of driving while distracted or impaired, and with the unwavering support of our community partners, **NO FEAR NO FUTURE** was born. To date, more than 10,000 students have participated in this life-changing, two-day initiative which exposes high school juniors and seniors to the realities and consequences of driving while distracted or impaired.



For the last 15 years, Junior League of Lafayette has partnered with Miles Perret Cancer Services for the **SMILES** program. The purpose of the SMILES program is to provide an escape and a supportive environment through age appropriate activities for children ages 5-18 who are fighting cancer or have a parent or sibling with cancer.



The Association of Junior Leagues International's **Kids in the Kitchen** program promotes child health and wellness by empowering children and youth to make healthy lifestyle choices, therefore preventing obesity and its associated health risks. In addition to guiding participants to create healthy and flavorful foods, an activities component introduces them to various forms of exercise to encourage a continued healthy and active lifestyle. Junior League of Lafayette's *Kids in the Kitchen* Committee spends two evenings each week, from September through April, teaching children from the Boys & Girls Clubs of Acadiana about healthy eating and healthy living.



Little Free Library



The Little Free Library is a national program sweeping the nation. More than 60,000 libraries have popped up in communities across the United States, and this year, Junior League of Lafayette's provisional class added five more to that list. Located in designated areas of need, the neighborhood book exchange boxes can be found at Bridge Ministry of Acadiana, The Outreach Center for Women and Children, Healing House, Boys & Girls Club of Acadiana - Jackie Unit, and Faith House.

The initiative is intended to help build communities, spark creativity, and inspire readers. Designed to look like little mailboxes, the libraries are meant to be easily accessible and contain books for anyone to borrow. The goal is that if a book is taken, another is left in its place for a fellow reader. Junior League of Lafayette members gathered hundreds of books in preparation for the project and completed final installation in March.

Junior League of Lafayette is thrilled to be part of an initiative that makes a direct impact in the community, and the response has already been a moving one. A mom and her ten-year-old daughter were seen utilizing a library and shared their excitement and appreciation for a project that filled such a big need in the area. The project is one that not only the provisional class is proud of, but one that has inspired all League members.


DONE IN A MEETING

Helping Neighbors in Need
December 2017

Each year, Junior League of Lafayette members conduct a "Done in a Meeting" project during a selected General Membership Meeting. In December, our Collaborative Opportunity Grants committee purchased supplies to fulfill a request for Catholic Services' The Emily House, a newly renovated 48-bed facility for women and children seeking shelter in Acadiana. With the new facility came the need for supplies, and Junior League of Lafayette was ready to help.

As our members entered City Club for the December meeting, they were met with hundreds of new pillows, blankets, and sheets waiting to be sorted, packaged and sealed with love for those in need. The group quickly got to work and in less than 30 minutes, prepared 200 bedding sets, each tied with a ribbon and hand-written note with an inspirational message for the women and children who will stay at the facility. "The Done in a Meeting project is one of my favorites each season," shared Cydra Wingerter, JLL member. "It's incredible to see us work so quickly to provide a tangible and much needed item to neighbors in our community. It's a true representation of our Mission in action."

Located in Lafayette, The Emily House represents Catholic Services of Acadiana's most recent endeavor to respond to women experiencing homelessness in Acadiana.




